Pre-Trip Expectations for all Students

Attend all pre-trip, on-site, and post-trip meetings and activities. Exceptions to this may be granted on a case-by-case basis by the Trip Leader and only for extenuating circumstances. Pre-trip gatherings are mandatory and serve to strengthen the group dynamic. Absences can lead to group breakdown, resentment, and frustration. Most trip meetings are held during community lunches.

Conduct

Students who are offered the opportunity to participate in a service trip represent St. Francis High School and are held to a high standard of behavior on and off campus at all times. Students must also stay with the group at all times during the trip. All school rules and policies apply. Participants also agree to follow the safety and clothing guidelines of our partner organizations.

Commitment to Simplicity and Immersion

Cell phone use and access is limited during service trips. Students will have access to their phones only during travel time and one evening for a mid-week check-in with family. This policy enables students to be present to the group and focused on their experience. Family and friends are invited to follow the SFHS Campus Ministry Facebook page and SFHS Instagram account for updates during the immersion experience. To help keep the experience one of simplicity, luggage is to be kept to one bag._______

Finances

Families must be current in all financial obligations to SFHS. Participants are responsible for the total cost of the trip. Trips generally cost between \$650 (local trip) and \$1500 (non-local trip); fee does not include food during travel days, incidentals, or souvenirs. All fees must be paid per the payment schedule. Failure to pay will result in removal from the trip. Trip fees and fundraising donations are not refundable unless a full-paying replacement can be found. All students must have current health insurance.

Application Process

- Attend the Junior Service Trip Interest Meeting at lunch in the CLC on October 26th (optional)
- Complete the Common Service Trip Application and return it to Campus Ministry with a \$100 deposit check no later than November 3rd, 2016. Deposits are refunded only if a student is not offered a place on one of the trips for which she applied.
- Choose 2 faculty/staff/coaches to submit a reference for you
- Participate in a scheduled group interview______
