

UC/CSU A-G Requirements

- ☐ SF graduation requirements meet most college admission requirements.
 - ☐ A-G requirements are the college admission requirements for the UCs and CSUs.
- ☐ St. Francis requirements exceed college admission requirements in some cases.
- ☐ Students are advised to check college websites for admission requirements.
- ☐ While the UCs and CSUs use grades after freshman year for the GPA calculation, grades in A G classes freshman year need to be a C or better

UC/CSU A-G Requirements



- (a): History/Social Science 2 years required
- (b): English 4 years required
 - (c): Mathematics 3 years required, 4 years recommended
- (d): Laboratory Science 2 years required, 3 years recommended
- (e): Language other than English (LOTE) 2 years required, 3 years recommended
 - (f): Visual and Performing Arts (VPA) 1 year required
- g): College Preparatory Electives -1 year required (Paschal Mystery & The Church)
- *UC/CSU calculate their own GPA using grades earned in all A-G courses completed
- between summer after 9th grade through summer after 11th grade. However, A-G classes
- in Freshman year need to be a C- or better.




Important Information



- ☐ Researching Courses to take
 - Review the Course Catalog (on school website under academic tab)
 - ☐ Talk to current teachers or teachers who teach the class she is interested in
 - ☐ Talk with other students
 - □ Attend Informational Meetings for AP/Honors Classes





When Requesting Courses, Keep in Mind

- ☐ Balance things to consider:
 - ☐ Homework / workload
 - ☐ More work sophomore year
 - After school commitments sports, academic teams, work, performing arts
- ☐ Play to her interests and strengths
- ☐ She is "*requesting* " classes not registering
 - ☐ There is no guarantee she will get every class she requests / wants
 - ☐ Prerequisites, conflicts, AP/Hon approval
 - ☐ There is no such thing as "trying out a class"
 - Often it's difficult/impossible to change a schedule once school starts

Honors/AP Application Process & Info.

- ☐ Your daughter received this exact info. in Freshman Advisory
 - ☐ Course description and prerequisites can be found in the Course Catalog (found on the SF Homepage)
 - ☐ Each department/course has its own process
 - Asst. Principal Ms. Moloney outlined the process for each class in a chart emailed out to all students on 12/20/24
- ☐ Deadline for applications January 29th
 - ☐ It is your daughter's responsibility to know the process
- ☐ Students will be notified **February 14th** regarding decision/waitlists
- ☐ Apply to all/any that are of interest

Difference Between AP and Honors Courses

Honors classes

- Advanced level course
- ☐ Student takes a final each semester

AP classes

- ☐ Advanced level course
- ☐ College Board Curriculum
- ☐ Student takes final in 1st semester, AP exam in the Spring
 - ☐ Students are <u>required</u> to take the AP Exam
- Opportunity to earn college credit

*Both earn one extra grade point per letter grade calculated into the students' GPA. Both options add rigor.

Honors/AP Courses (cont.)



- ▶ □ What to think about regarding Honors and AP Classes:
 - ☐ We recommend students take no more than 3 H/AP courses per year.
 - ☐ Students don't *have* to take an H/AP class.
 - ☐ They need to think about why they may want to take one.
 - ☐ Students are committing to a year-long course.
 - ☐ It's important for your daughter to meet with her counselor to discuss:
 - ☐ The rigorous academic demands and time commitment required for H/AP level courses, including summer work
 - ☐ Her outside commitments and extracurricular activities
 - Balance
- ☐ Limitations with the Master Schedule
 - ☐ It's very possible there will be schedule conflicts and students may not get all of the H/AP courses they select.

Community College Course



- ☐ January 15: Freshman Advisory
- ☐ January 22: Counseling Parent Night
- ☐ January 29: AP/Honors Application Deadline
- ☐ February 14: Notified of AP/Honors acceptances/waitlists
- ☐ January 24-March 8th: Individual meeting with counselor to discuss course selection and spring semester check-in
- ☐ March 3-7: Students request courses in PowerSchool
- ☐ March 10 14 : Course Verification
 - Student needs to bring parent signed Course Registration Form to the Counseling office to be verified by a Counselor

May 21 - Last day for schedule request changes


Academic Rigor

The term *rigor* is used by educators to describe instruction, schoolwork, learning experience and educational expectations that are academically, intellectually, and *personally* challenging.

Academic rigor is different for each student!

St. Francis High School does not provide student ranking on transcripts.






Finding the Transcript in PowerSchool

□ Sign in to the PowerSchool Student Portal at stfrancishs.powerschool.com/public (or sign in through the St. Francis Webpage)
 □ Click on the Grades and Attendance page
 □ Click on the "Transcript" tab at the top


It's important to review the transcript yearly.

Verifying Name and Birthday on

- ☐ Students should check their official full name (listed on Social Security card)
- ☐ Then they should verify that their name is correct on their transcript. This can cause confusion down the road during the college application process if there is a discrepancy.
- ☐ Transcripts can be viewed in PowerSchool.
- ☐ She should also check that her birthday is correct.
- ☐ If there are any errors, please contact our Registrar, Mrs. Thompson.
