General Summary

What is the primary purpose of this position?

The Maintenance Technician is responsible for general building maintenance and equipment operations, including special projects. The person in this position must possess a high degree of attention to detail and concentration on quality of work. As the position operates heavy equipment and machinery, often in close proximity to students and staff, attention to safety must be the first priority.
